

Friends,

And all of a sudden we find ourselves in Lent.

How did that happen so quickly? It also means that we have come to the end of our season of following the Jesus-Shaped People programme. It's been part of our life together for six months. Maybe it seems longer to some people and like it's whizzed by to others.

We will be arranging a review morning with Gordon Dey the founder of JSP, soon to give all of us the chance to look back on what has been, I think, a vibrant and challenging few months. A few initial reflections from me would be:

It has been exciting for me to hear so many people talking about Jesus. You'd think we'd do that quite often as Christians, but I think this material has re-gathered our focus a touch on who Jesus is and, of course, helped by those five priorities, the material has laid out for us as things to focus on. People, Team Building, Teaching, Prayer and Prophetic Challenge made us think about what makes us distinctive as people and a community who follow Jesus and live his way.

Whether you've loved the material, the format, agreed with what's been preached or disagreed with it volubly (thankfully that's not hordes of you!) we've all been quite deeply focused on Jesus, worshipping God and engaging with finding ways of living the best way we can and sharing the love of God as widely as we can.

That's what Churches are supposed to do.

Because of this and a lot of other reasons besides, we have a lot to be thankful for. Another would be that it's been wonderful seeing so many people leading services and preaching and teaching, using the JSP material in a variety of ways. I'm often struck by how fortunate we are with the number, quality and diversity of people we have who lead and preach for us and it's been excellent to see new people taking their first steps in this regard recently too.

House groups are great, both as a way of 'going deeper' into the themes that we've been looking at together and

also as the quickest way of getting to know people and finding a group of people to pray with and put into practice what we've been learning. It's been fantastic to see new groups developing and established groups welcoming new people. I know I often use these letters to encourage people who haven't joined a group to do so, but if you haven't yet, I'd really encourage you to do so in the next few weeks.

So, what next? In practical terms, over the next few weeks we'll be following the Lectionary as it leads us through Jesus' journey to the Cross at the first Easter, to his resurrection and beyond. What I'm hoping we will do along-side looking at the gospel narrative of the first Easter story is to spend some time looking at Psalms and the Old Testament too. We've not taught much on the Old Testament during my time at Emmanuel, so I thought perhaps this season might be a good time to start.

Later in April, we will look at Spirit-Filled Church, a programme from Jesus-Shaped People which traces the five priorities of Jesus in the life of the first Churches and asks us to do the same thing. More details about that next month.

I've been wondering recently what it would have been like for people who met Jesus in this phase in his ministry. He'd 'set his face to Jerusalem and was determined to obediently complete the task that God had given to him, so that the outcome that he had lived and would die for, reconciliation between God and people, would be completed. He'd already shown how focused he was on living God's way. He was single-minded in making sure that the priorities that God had set out for him (they're above, if you've forgotten them or skipped to a less-dense looking paragraph) were the ways that he decided what needed to be done. He was committed to seeing the task all the way through to the end, to eventual glorious victory. All the while, love for God and love for the people he had come to serve were the beating heart of everything that he did and said.

And so as we look back to what has gone before over these last months and forward to what we seek to do in the weeks and months to come, it seems to me that we might do well to do what Paul encouraged the Church in Philippi:

Work hard to show the results of your salvation, obeying God with deep reverence and fear. For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him. (Philippians 2:12b-13). We aren't saved by our works, but one response to the love of God shown to us in Jesus Christ is to be totally committed to the ministry of reconciliation that he has given to us.

Let's be known as a Church which brings people together, is kind, generous and merciful; all of those things. Let's be known as a Church which is full of the Spirit of God and speaks prophetically to the people around us about how life can be and about the truth of God's love. Let's be a team, working together for the goal of knowing Christ and the power of his resurrection.

On the morning I'm writing this to you all, I've had the great joy of preparing one of our young people for confirmation. This follows a service at Emmanuel last week that was led by some of the young people and should both go down in the annals of Emmanuel's history as a fantastic moment and also be, I hope, a catalyst for much more to come. It is exceptionally good to see new people, at whatever age or stage stepping further into life with God and into ministry, of whatever sort.

On the same day that the confirmation takes place at Boothville (March 11th) Bishop Donald will confer on Maureen (Precious) Luke his License, with Pastoral Responsibility for Boothville Community Church. I am so excited about this. We've all seen Precious's ministry develop in these last years and I am hugely gratified that she is going to be stepping up a little more with myself, Phil and Doug as she gains more experience of leading a congregation. She has already been doing a fabulous job and now Bishop Donald wishes to recognise that with a certificate and his blessing.

In practical terms not a huge amount will change. On a day to day basis Precious will be leading, under the incumbent (that's me). I trust that you will pray for her as she steps into this development of her role with us and continue to encourage her, as she is such an encouragement to us. March 11th promises to be a great day at Boothville and this will be an exciting season in the life of the congregation.

I always write too much in these letters so that Liz has to make the font too small. Sorry about that. It's just that there's so much going on, so much to celebrate and so much to look forward to. What a vibrant life we have together. What a great God we serve.

Food Bank ... needs YOUR help


We are greatly blessed in that we receive so many generous donations of food & toiletries etc. every week, that enable us to help many families in difficult times.

Report on the Deanery Synod

As Emmanuel Group representatives on the Deanery Synod, Nick Bewley-Tippler and I attended the most recent meeting held on the 6th February. Well, I say attended; we did have some work to do; we stewarded the Synod as it was held in the Sports Hall at Emmanuel.

The Deanery Synod is made up of Church of England churches in Greater Northampton. From each Church there were the ministers and the representatives of each congregation (Lay).

Unlike previous meetings where there has been only one speaker, this time representatives were invited from well-known local groups; The Emmanuel Foodbank (Trussel Trust), Baby Basics, the Hope Centre, The Night Shelter, Crime to Christ, Street Pastors and School Pastors. Each group gave a short introduction and then retired to their displays to give more information.

I could not help but notice how many members of our Group of Churches were involved in the various different outreach groups.

Our recent Jesus Shaped People subjects have led us to focus on social Injustice and the need to reach out to the desperate, the needy and the disadvantaged. This meeting was so appropriate.

It was clear that we all have a lot to learn and a lot of work to do.

After Jesus-Shaped People has concluded at the end of February, we will spend a few weeks following the suggesting readings from the Church of England's suggested readings (Lectionary) for each Sunday.

Fear not! We're not moving to a new system of having 4 readings in every service. However, the table above gives you an outline of where those us who are leading and preaching through March and Easter Weekend may be starting our explorations of the Word from. I have asked those preaching and leading to give particular attention to readings from the Book of Psalms and from the Old Testament as they illuminate our journey through the Gospel readings which lead us on Jesus's journey to the Cross and the Resurrection.

Material will be provided for house groups. I hope that when you gather for prayer, fellowship, food and to read from the Bible together during March you too might give special attention to the Psalms and Old Testament readings and that they point you to Jesus

It is important for us to use all of the Bible in our worship of God and in our

seeking to follow his way, rather than concentrating merely on the gospels or letters of the early Church. I pray that together we might have a contemplative and fruitful rest of Lent and season of Easter together.

God So Loved the World

'For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

This verse has been described as 'the greatest verse in the Bible', as it enables us to understand the events of Good Friday and Easter Day. The cross and resurrection reveal the depth of God's love for each of us.

God's love is unconditional: God demonstrated the extent of his love by sending His Son into this world, to show us what it looks like: 'God with skin on'! God graciously loves us, as none of us deserves it. 'There is nothing we can do to make God love us more. There is nothing we can do to make God love us less.' (Philip Yancey).

God's love is sacrificial: The cross is the supreme demonstration of God's love, as Jesus identifies with a fallen, suffering world. He died for our sins, removing the barrier between us and God, giving access into God's presence and release from the power of sin and death.

God's love is accessible: Jesus' resurrection makes His eternal life available to all who put their trust in Him. It's an offer of life with purpose, in which we can know God personally, both now and for eternity.

Bobby Moore described receiving the World Cup from the Queen in 1966 as terrifying: 'I noticed that the Queen was wearing some beautiful white gloves. I looked down at my hands and they were completely covered with mud'! Although we approach God with dirty and spoilt lives, by the cross and resurrection, we can shake hands with a holy God. He offers us 'life in all its fullness', with healing, forgiveness, peace and a fresh start in life!

WAYS TO BOOST YOUR GIVING.

If you pay income tax

Sign a GIFT AID FORM and use weekly or monthly envelopes (or bank standing orders). We can claim back the tax HMRC has deducted from your income before you get it, so we claim back an extra 25p for every £1 you donate each week or month.

If you don't pay income tax and use monthly envelopes or banker's order for regular giving, consider using WEEKLY ENVELOPES instead.

The government gives a 25% (ie¾) top up to charities for small cash donations (£20 or less) subject to certain limits.

NB This is applicable to all such donations whether in loose cash or envelopes, but of course envelopes encourage regular giving.

Therefore, if you normally give say a) £40 or b) £50 using Emmanuel monthly envelopes or bankers order, instead give £10 each week using weekly envelopes and in a four Sunday month your boosted giving would be (£40 + 25% of £40) = £50.00

in a five Sunday month your boosted giving would be (£50 + 25% of £50) = £62.50


