Why Pray?

Hi Friends,

For the next 3 months, we as a church family will be focusing on prayer and although there are many different types of prayer and different ways in which we can speak with God......why pray!

It's very special when we pray, but when we pray collectively, it is extremely powerful and the Bible is full of accounts where 'praying' had miraculous results. That hasn't

changed. God is still answering prayers today.

We are encouraged to 'Pray without ceasing' 1 Thessalonians 5: 17, but how does that benefit us?

Prayer is a positive act of faith. 'If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer' Matthew 21:22

Prayer enables us to focus on God. 'Set your mind on the things which are above, not on the things which are on the earth' Colossians 3:2

Prayer leaders us into the throne room of God. 'Let us

then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need' Hebrews 4:16

Prayer can help us come to a greater understanding of God's purpose for our lives. 'And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose' Romans 8: 28

Prayer reminds us to always be thankful. 'Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song' Psalm 95: 2

These may help when thinking about how we can pray:

Breath prayers: Inhale one worshipful phrase and exhale another. **Personalise Scripture in prayer:** Substitute a name or the words

"I" or "me" where appropriate.

Read Scripture as you pray. Read a verse or two, then stop to

pray what comes to mind.

Continue the process several times throughout a passage of Scripture.

Involve all of your senses. Hold a cross or another physical reminder of your faith. Light candles.

Travel and pray. Walk and pray for your neighbours and community. Pray for the children as you wait in line to pick up yours.

Pray through the alphabet. Think of a name of God or a characteristic of God that begins with each letter. Or use each letter as a prompt for a certain person for whom you can pray.

It is a joy and a privilege to pray for our church, our community, our nation and the world and to give thanks for all that God is doing amongst us.

My prayer is that:

Our faith and prayer life will deepen

We will move closer to the heart of God

Our hearts will be encouraged

We listen for God's response and act upon it

We get a deeper understanding of the power of prayer




The main recipient of the physical donation is to be the Weston Favell Food Bank. The meeting was reminded of the statistics that appeared in BERT regarding provision of Food Bank parcels.

In the previous month the Foodbank supplied 296 adults and 436 children with 240 parcels.

The Church is pleased to welcome the administrator of the Food Bank Simon Burgess, who will make a presentation.

The congregation was encouraged to donate items that are currently in shortage. These items were listed on the leaflet and pictures of them displayed on the board



What's in a Food Parcel?

Foodbanks provide a minimum of three days' nutritionally balanced, non-perishable tinned and dried foods that have been donated by the local community. Trussell Trust have worked with nutritionists to develop a food parcel that contains sufficient nutrition for adults and children, for at least three days of healthy, balanced meals for individuals and families. It is only supposed to be to fill a stop gap, not as their main means of shopping.

On Friday 30th August, we organised a Litter Pick of the Billing Brook Lakes, working alongside Brookside and Thorplands residents associations.



You shop. Amazon gives.

I know many of you have used it for your Amazon purchases but sadly this will have to change as Amazon now have their own system which must be used from now on. Amazon's new system is called "smile.amazon.co.uk" and works in a similar way to Easyfundraising.

I have set up a new Emmanuel charity account with smile amazon so that you can still generate cash for Emmanuel with them.

To use the new system for your Amazon purchases you need to :-

- **1.** Go to www.smile.amazon.co.uk and first register by inserting your email address and then your existing Amazon account Password. This only has to be done the first time you use it.
- **2.** Stay on the smile.amazon.co.uk website ready to search for the item you wish to purchase.
- **3.** Before searching for your item please amend the "Charity" to Emmanuel Group of Churches as it will normally default to a different one. Again you only have to do this once.
- **4.** Search and choose your item which should then show "this qualifies for a donation to Emmanuel Group of Churches". I'm not sure this will apply to all items chosen but almost 100%.
- **5.** Go to check out which will use your existing account information (including credit card details already registered with them) and in all other respects be with your existing Amazon account.
- **6.**Always access Amazon through www.smileamazon.co.uk for all your future purchases you can save it as one of your "Favourites".

The cross stands still while the world turns

This summer, we have been celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 space mission – the excitement of Neil

Armstrong's small step/giant leap on 20th July 1969 as he and Buzz Aldrin became the first human beings to land on the moon. It's been good to remember the often-forgotten third astronaut, Michael Collins, who remained in lunar orbit and was on the far side of the moon when his colleagues took those famous steps.

All three astronauts shared one particularly special moment, the first sight of something never seen before – the earth the way it looks from the moon. When the astronauts first saw the earthrise, they were struck by how the predominant colour was not green, but blue, as two-thirds of the earth's surface is sea (indeed, once a day almost all you can see from space is the Pacific Ocean).

This was also very clear from the astonishing artwork on display in the Cathedral recently. 'Gaia' by artist Luke Jerram is a seven metre diameter globe, suspended in space. It features detailed NASA imagery of the earth's surface taken from space, and turns completely every four minutes.

When I saw it in the Cathedral, I thought it looked beautiful and fragile. It filled me with wonder and a feeling of protectiveness. I was reminded that the biggest crisis facing our nation (even more important than Brexit) is the ecological catastrophe that scientists are trying to engage us in addressing.

I was also struck by the astonishing view from the Cathedral Nave of 'Gaia' behind the equally beautiful hanging cross. Frank Roper's 1975 depiction of the crucifixion is 15 feet high, weighs more than half a ton and represents Jesus' suffering and his watching over the Cathedral. It carries the Latin inscription "Stat Crux Dum Volvitor Orbis" —

"the cross stands still while the world turns".

In this time of great uncertainty, it's good to be still and recall that God shares our lives and watches over us.




