I hope and pray that you are well, safe and that you know Christ and the power of his resurrection in these strange and unusual times.

We need something to hold on to when things in life are uncertain. We need to decide who or what to trust when what we thought were firm foundations around us become shifting sands.

That's how it's felt during the time of Covid-19 Coronavirus to me - the majority of the things I used to do and the ways I used to do them are not open to me at the moment, and so I face a choice: to throw my hands up in the air and panic on the one hand or to do what I can to draw close to God on the other. It has been wonderful to see the way that we have adapted and developed new approaches to staying in touch with each other, delivering services, praying for each other and for the wider world and supporting the local community.

don't know how long it will be until we are able to meet together in church buildings, but we do know that when we do it will not be like church as we knew it before.

There are bound to be many changes and new approaches needed. It is possible that the 'new normal' of physical gatherings may even be more unsettling than this period of not being able to meet together physically has been. I know many of us miss seeing each other greatly and miss sharing in worship and communion in the same room together. Personally I miss leaving the house.

If you find yourself in need of help, a listening ear or something else in these days do get in touch with us in the Church Office. We will do all we can to find the right way to support you.



What happens to my requests?



faith in troubled times

Three thousand years ago, a person of deep faith wrote - and the people of God first sang some of the most beautiful words in history: *"The Lord is my Shepherd, I will not want. He leads me in green pasture."* (Psalm 23: 1,2)

They voice a confident trust that with God as their shepherd, **they will not wander:** *"He leads me besides still waters. He restores my soul."* (vs 2 and 3) With remarkable faith, they declare that whatever life may bring, with the Lord as their shepherd, **they will not worry.**

They sing of God's ever-presence besides them at the darkest times: *"Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me. Your rod and your staff comfort me."* (v 4)

We are living through extraordinary and disturbing times. The coronavirus is causing death and deep disruption to our normal patterns of living. Tragedy has included members of the diocesan family. The total lockdown, self-isolation, suspension of public worship and closure of church buildings means that we have had no option but (in the phrase of the Archbishops) "to become a different sort of church".

People have found new ways of caring for each other. Good neighbour schemes have emerged. Our telephones have been busy. Many have shopped for the housebound, clapped in the street, lit candles, and put teddy bears and NHS rainbow signs in their windows. Many churches have produced deeply moving

acts of worship online.

I've discovered social media I didn't know existed! We have found new ways of being "together apart" and "holding hands in the Spirit". I believe as a Church we have rediscovered that our spiritual lives must be rooted in daily prayer and Bible reading at home, not just Sunday worship in church. Jesus is with us wherever we are - we hold on to his promise that he will be with us whatever happens.

I have recently become chair of a small national charity called ReSource whose aim is to help "little, local and ordinary churches" draw on the Holy Spirit for discipleship and mission.

The Director has written these helpful words: "Whatever these coming days hold, let's be mindful of one another, alert to the cry of a hurting world, and confident in the love of God, from which nothing can separate us." May God bless us all.

Community Care Update – June and July

As you would expect, most things are still cancelled for now, but I thought it would be good to give you some feedback on the deliveries I have been doing and what it might mean to the community work and the debt centre.

Deliveries and foodbank

The Café Emm and foodbank deliveries have been unexpectedly busy and successful. Both have drawn new people into the volunteering world. Many have been furloughed, or had enough of work, and have responded to the call we put out on facebook and in emails.

Some of the volunteers had really busy social lives, but this was taken from them as all groups stop running, so opportunities to serve further were in short supply and jumped in to help.

I have noticed when making deliveries is that often, because people are isolated for what ever reason, we may be the only human contact they have all week. It does allow us a minute or two to chat with people, - socially distancing of course.

We would love to do be able to talk longer, but are limited by the other deliveries we still need to do. Please pray for these people, and others in the community who are isolated, that they find ways to communicate with others.

I have been helping a lot in foodbank when I can, and want to add my own personal view.

It has been unbelievably busy, not just on Monday's and Wednesday's, when the Foodbank is open but the deliveries on Friday's are up to 60 a week now, served by about 8 drivers in all different car sizes. With the lockdown not appearing to relax too much yet, it will continue to test the numbers of parcels on collection and delivery days.

It is also testing food supplies. Food donations are down but we know people can't get out to donate food. However, people have been very generous in increasing their financial giving and for that we thank you all. It does mean we are needing to do 5 times as much shopping as we have done before but it does have the advantage of being able to buy what is needed when a particular item is getting low or has run out.

One new person helping in the foodbank has been a little gem, and it looks like they might stay to help with foodbank They have a wealth of experience, not specifically with foodbanks, but with ways of talking to suppliers to negotiate what we are after, and finding new suppliers as well.

Debt Centre

Currently I am having detailed training online. Then we will train the rest of the team. We know the lockdown is affecting people's finances and want to be ready and able to help when the time comes.

And finally...

I have been asked by Julie, the fundraising expert, to collate some words from people I work with which will help with her funding bids to enable my work here at Emmanuel to continue beyond December.

This might be through working at FISH, Drop In, Board Games, Foodbank, Messy and other community projects I have run in the past, or look to run in the future. It has been really encouraging to read the comments that have been made by people I have worked with and also how new adventures have come together and new partnerships built.

The last few months have been the most challenging I hope I will ever come across and it seems, as I write we aren't out of it yet. The community spirit has come to the fore in an amazing and wonderful way, so let's pray communities will continue to stick together and help each other and come out stronger than we have ever been.

The foodbank has been operating an express social distancing service since the beginning of the pandemic. This has been challenging. I have broken the service down into four areas to make it easier to understand:

Change of Service

The foodbank service has been moved from Emmanuel Church into the Unit on the 1st floor of the Weston Favell Shopping Centre. This was something that had been agreed by the management team prior to the Pandemic. The new venue is much easier to store, pack and distribute the growing amount of food parcels, enabling us to meet the needs of our community.

We have now also included deliveries of food to those in financial hardship who are self isolating. These are delivered on Fridays.

Change of demand

In April 2019 the total amount of people we fed was 502, in April 2020 the amount of people we have fed so far is around 600 and still growing. If this trend continues then we will have fed double the amount of people in April 2020 compared to April 2019.

Donations

We have received an astonishing amount of money via our giving page and people donating cash. However, food donations have decreased as it has been difficult for people to buy extra produce at this time. This has been a challenge but we are starting to build our stocks to enable us to deliver the amount of food parcels for those who need them. We welcome donations of food or money. The foodbank is open Mon, Tues, Weds and Friday mornings 10am – 2pm for anyone who would like to donate.

Volunteers

Due to self isolation we did initially lose a lot of volunteers. We have currently been working with a team of 10 volunteers. There has also been a stream of people who have volunteered their services just for the time of the pandemic. All the volunteers are working well together and have risen to the challenge. They are fantastic.


Talking Jesus – free course



SILENCE is GOLDEN

This is not a homage to that great song from my youth 'Silence is Golden' sung by Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, but rather the story of a journey that God has taken me on in recent years.

A few years ago I felt the desire to improve and deepen my prayer life, so off I went to 'The Manna House' to buy or borrow any books on prayer. It did not take me long to realise that I was not destined to become one of the great intercessors of the church! Whether it was because I am a naturally lazy and undisciplined person I'm not sure, but I could not get over the feeling that prayer should be something more than a list of wants from God. So I decided to go back to grass roots and echoed the words of the disciples "Lord, teach us to pray". After all I reasoned if he taught them why shouldn't he teach me! But what happened was entirely unexpected.

I spent several days just sitting, waiting on God, occasionally offering the Lord's prayer or reading a Psalm. I began to really enjoy the silence and sitting in God's presence but I wondered when was he going to start teaching me about prayer! Little did I realise at the time that this was it, this was indeed prayer but at a deeper level than I had known.

Around this time someone gave me a little book by Christian writer Joyce Huggett on 'Contemplative prayer'. As I read this I began to realise that this was indeed the path that God was taking me on, but I couldn't believe that I was enjoying it so much. The times of silence and reflection and the fact that occasionally God would pop a tiny morsel of truth into my heart whether personal or a greater knowledge of him.

I believe bringing silence and some solitude into our lives is very necessary for our spiritual well being, but also quite a difficult discipline. Sometimes it can be that when we enter a time of silence alone, where we are without people to talk to, books to read, or TV to watch or phone calls to make or the internet to view then often an inner chaos can open up within us.

Distractions

Sometimes these feelings can be so overwhelming that we can't wait to get busy again, sitting in silence does not mean that we immediately shut out all our inner doubts, anxieties, fears, bad memories, unresolved conflicts or whatever. In fact when we are on our own, removed from outer distractions, our inner turmoil manifests itself in full force.

We should not be frightened by this, or be tempted to give up, as we all well know there are many distractions in prayer. Some of them are fairly obvious and personal to us but I have learnt not to necessarily grit my teeth and will them away, which often does not work but to realise that there may be times when through these things God may actually be speaking to us, out of love, wanting to heal us.

One of the first things we realise as we enter along this path is that our lives are incredibly cluttered and many things even sensible, good things press their agenda upon us. We can learn to ignore many of these things but if something continually bothers us or causes unnecessary anxiety or worry then God may be speaking to us about it and we need to ask him to perhaps take us on a journey to discover where the root of these feelings come from. I had such an experience fairly recently.

I am a person who naturally feels inferior to others, my height is undoubtedly a factor, my lack of academic achievement or whatever it may be can be rooted in pride of course, but it is far more than that and as God took me back through my life I began to realise that I had continually strived to be accepted, had always felt rejection when there wasn't any and always felt the odd one out, (I actually believe that there are quite a few people who feel this way and I hope this is an encouragement to you.)

God took me back to some of the roots of these feelings going back into my childhood, even as a very young child where these seeds were sown, often people, kind, well meaning people even our parents in their care for us can inflict upon us their own sense of anxiety and stress. God showed me how delicate our process of formation is and how wonderfully we are created and has made me realise how sensitively we must deal with people because we can affect them for life.

So, you ask, am I now free of these feelings? nah not really, but I do know much of the power over me has gone from them, I no longer feel trapped, I have my moments but realise much has changed. I am who I am and I have learned to accept myself, because fundamental in this process I have come to realise how much God loves me warts and all.

Contemplative prayer is becoming much more a way of life for me now, one of the 'benefits' of the lock down is that we all have much more time on our hands and I hope we can use it to explore God more deeply and I really would encourage us to make a time each day for solitude and silence even if it is only 10 minutes, we don't have to pray anything, indeed if you do then you may be defeating the purpose. Just 'be' in the presence of God and see where he wants to take you.

Just as a final paragraph can I say that whilst I have emphasised a particular form of prayer I do realise that there is a lot more to it. Intercessions, the call to Christian action and behaviour and much more. But I have found that in silence, contemplative prayer can lead to a solid base where many of these things can spring from.

A testimony by Dr Julian Urban, a 38-year-old doctor in Lombardy

Up until two weeks ago, my colleagues and I were atheists... I always laughed at my parents when they went to church.

Nine days ago, a 75-year-old pastor came to us for medical help. He had grave respiratory problems, but he had a Bible with him and it impressed us that he was reading the Bible to the people who were dying and holding their hands.

We were all tired, discouraged doctors, psychologically and physically spent. Strangely, we found that we were listening to him... We realised that we have reached the limits of what man can do. We needed God, and we have begun to ask for his help, when we have a few moments free.

We cannot believe that we who were fierce atheists are now seeking for interior peace by asking the Lord to help us...

The 75-year old pastor has now died. But, despite the fact that in the last three weeks we have had over 120 people die in our unit, and we are all exhausted and feel destroyed; he succeeded, despite his own condition and our own difficulties, to bring us a PEACE that we no longer hoped to find.
