"Above all else, Christmas is about the coming of Jesus into our world as one of us".

Here we are at the end of another year with Christmas fast approaching and the wonderful story of God's coming to earth in Jesus. God coming to us in a tiny baby is an astounding, truly wonderful thing that I'm not sure we ever come to terms with, much to be celebrated and cause for great worship.

Another thing that amazes me is the total faith and obedience of both Mary and Joseph. How could they possibly have imagined any of what was to follow when this humble local couple announced their engagement?! Certainly, a hurried marriage with Mary coming to the altar with a "baby bump" was not what they planned. It wasn't like our culture where people are fairly tolerant of a pregnancy outside of marriage. It was seen as a deeply shameful thing in those days. Yet somehow Mary found it in herself to say "I am the Lord's servant. May everything you have said about me come true." Joseph 'did as the angel of the Lord commanded and took Mary as his wife' despite all the confusion and questions.

I wonder how we might have coped given that situation? Would even a visit from an Archangel, even Gabriel himself, have convinced you or me to drop all our plans and give ourselves completely to God's plan at the risk of likely disapproval and rejection by most of our family, friends and possibly even punishment from their community?

Could Mary or Joseph have said "no" to God? I don't know, but they didn't. They committed themselves into God's hands and I'm sure that God, in his grace, gave them the faith they needed. Faith to journey to Bethlehem with Mary at full term; faith to trust that they would find somewhere to shelter, even if it turned out to be a stable, then much needed faith for Mary's delivery! **Even after Jesus' birth** and the visitors who came to worship had been and gone, there was another unexpected turn as things went "side-ways" again and Joseph and Mary had to run for their lives as refugees to Egypt, to avoid Jesus being killed. Could all of this really be part of God's plan?! It was, and while there are plenty of unanswered questions as to why it should be so, Joseph and Mary continued to follow in faith and obedience. Amazing... and so impressive!

I wonder if you ever look back on how things have gone for you. How has following Jesus changed your life or taken you in unexpected directions?

This year will be my 12th Christmas with Emmanuel Group, and there are all sorts of great memories of things we've done together and unexpected ways that God has led us. By Christmas 2008, the year we came to Northampton, I was just about getting back to full-time work after I nearly didn't make it at all following a serious illness in the summer.

When I signed on for a further 3-year period of ministry in 2018, it was to work with Emmanuel toward the change in Free Church minister. It never occurred to me that in the November things would go "sideways" as I would fall ill and be off work for several months and end up returning in a redefined role, part-time with Emmanuel and part-time with the Methodist Circuit. It has been really hard work for Haydon and the Emmanuel leadership, and I can't thank them enough for their care and support. This was not what any of us expected at all. Could all of this really be part of God's plan?! While there are plenty of unanswered questions as to how or why it could be so, the Lord has been faithful and he is Emmanuel, God with us.

Above all else, Christmas is about the coming of Jesus into our world as one of us. Through Jesus his Son, God came among us as a human but without sin, the one perfect human uniquely qualified and equipped to bring God and people back together. Through faith we can be restored as children of God and enter into his gift of eternal life, forever with God, instead of an eternity separated from him by sin.

Surely we must truly celebrate!

God called both Mary and Joseph to be a vital part in his plans to rescue the world and its people. And He calls us to part of that too, to share the invitation of his presence and his love.

No doubt the New Year will bring new things and fresh challenges

for each of us, sometimes unexpected. Can I encourage you to be inspired by Mary & Joseph's example and something else the angel told Mary: "For nothing will be impossible with God. "Whatever God calls you to do, seek to respond in faith and obedience, trust in God's purpose for you even if you don't always understand "why" or if it all seems to be going a bit "side-ways"! I've been so humbled and moved by the generosity and compassion of the people coming to the gigs and donating. It's disgraceful that in 2019 people can't

afford to put even the most basic food on the table. More than 1.5 tonnes of food has been raised for those that need it, and I can't wait to see how much we can achieve".

The concert at the Derngate was on the 5th November. The band had a promotional CD of which all the proceeds (£230) came to the food bank, Caroline Giles, Jayne Redding and myself had collection buckets which in total collected £269.65 So all in all, it was a very profitable night for food bank... a grand total of £499.65. - Thank you Squeeze!

Encouraging Story

At the back of the church he picked up a copy of the Mission Opportunities magazine that I produce.

The account told how the refugee then took part in a mission training program and is now teaching and preaching.

This man in Liverpool felt really challenged by the article. He saw that if this refugee from a Muslim background could find faith, then so could he. He is now an active member of the Liverpool church. I must admit I was surprised when I heard this man's story. It encouraged me to discover yet again that God often works in ways we just aren't expecting.




