Time Marches On.

Friends, have you noticed a change in the weather recently? Time marches on!

Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness,

Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun;

Conspiring with him how to load

With fruit the vines that round the thatch-eves run.

October – a time for giving thanks. November – a time for remembering. The bitter sweet season of autumn. Which reflects much of how life truly is. Ups and downs, times of great joy and times of deep sorrow, of angst, perhaps even fear as we continue to move forward with the uncertainties of managing life under these present circumstances and into the challenges of winter. We cannot escape the uncertainties of life. Neither can we truly control them. It's a lesson we all have to learn, however we might wish it otherwise.

It's time now, perhaps, for a moment, to stop; to press the pause button of the 'now'. Put aside for one moment the busyness of mind and body, take a breath, listen to the silence, look around and see things through quiet refreshed eyes. And say 'thank you', and give praise. It's no mistake that in cultures all over the world the autumn is a time of giving thanks. Here in the northern hemisphere it coincides with October. It's the time of Harvest Festival celebrations in churches and in schools all over this country. It's no coincidence that so many faiths and cultures take this time to say thank you for the harvest.

There's something about the rhythm of the land which is the very essence of who we are and the rhythm of our lives. John Keats captures a beautifully crafted romantic image of autumn in his poem. As I read this poem, I also reflect that the rhythm of the land – the soil, the sowing and reaping, the mixture of rain and sun, of warmth and chill – is beyond my control.

We may trust science to account for the way these can interact to produce ripe harvests and abundant crops. But I believe that there is something – someone – beyond science, someone who gives meaning and purpose to science, meaning and purpose to 'me'. And it is to God that I turn, just like the Psalmist, to acknowledge God's majesty and generosity and grace.

I pause; I look at the beauty of the gardens and fields with fresh

eyes, and I say 'Thank you, God, for all of this.' In Psalm 67, the Psalmist writes, "May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine upon us ... May the peoples praise you, O God; ... May the nations be glad and sing for joy, ... Then the land will yield its harvest, and God, our God, will bless us."

November brings a different time. A time to remember. All those who have lost their lives in conflict and war for something far beyond their daily material lives – for peace and freedom, liberty and democracy. We pain at the futility of war, but we remember with pride the part played by countless millions of all nations, faiths and cultures during the last century or so.

Memories, and along with them, all those dear ones who are no longer with us. We say thank you to them all for what they have done to enable us to be who we are today. The bitter sweet of the autumn season.

And then on to Advent Sunday, 29th November, and the long journey to the Manger, and celebration once more of the birth of the One who changed the whole course of history – and us – Jesus. The autumn is good preparation for that journey on to Bethlehem.

As for the future? Who knows. There are many impatient to come to church. Especially to celebrate Harvest and Remembrance Sunday. Especially when you hear of other churches which seem to manage with no issues. We hope to have good news shortly about opening up first Boothville Church and then Emmanuel Church (with Rectory Farm Church dependent on how the school wishes to proceed). We will continue to run our online services each Sunday and midweek. However, we do need to pay due regard to the messages from the government and from our faith leaders, and to act responsibly for the sake of those who are vulnerable among us. We will keep you well informed of progress with re-opening our churches.

In the meantime, just take some time this autumn to put aside the present worries and concerns for the future, over which we have little real control. Stop. Be silent. And give thanks. You will feel so much better for it!

God bless you all. I pray that you will remain safe and well. Amen.

If you are helping others at this time, remember to still leave space and time for yourself. Going the extra mile for other people all the time will only ensure one thing; your collapse. Work in teams. Even the Good Samaritan did not attempt to help the injured man all on his own; he brought in the innkeeper. By sharing the problem, they solved it!

Why are you facing such temptation?

'Happy is the man who doesn't give in and do wrong when he is tempted, for afterwards he will get ...his reward.' James 1:12

Are you facing a temptation of some sort? It is easy to think of it as a bad thing. But it can become a stepping-stone rather than a stumbling block. Just think: it is as much an opportunity to do the right thing, as the wrong thing. Temptation just gives you the choice!

God develops the fruit of the Spirit in us by allowing circumstances into our lives in which we are tempted – in order that we might express the exact opposite quality! For instance: He teaches us to love by allowing unlovely people into our lives. It takes no character to love people who are lovely and love you.

God teaches us joy in the midst of sorrow by urging us to turn to Him for comfort and strength when all other support is gone. God grows peace in us by helping us learn to trust in Him in situations where we're tempted to worry or be afraid. Likewise, patience grows through having to wait...

You can't claim to be good if you've never been tempted to be bad; or to be faithful if you have never had the chance to be unfaithful. Integrity grows through defeating dishonesty; humility grows as you refuse to give place to pride. Endurance develops when you reject the temptation to give up.

The truth is: when temptation comes into your life, see it for what it is: a chance for you to grow closer to Jesus.

THE NEW NORMAL?


We find ourselves living through extraordinary and demanding times, where many things that might previously have been relied upon to be reasonably stable and secure have suddenly become quite provisional and uncertain – whether that be income and employment, education and future prospects, health and wellbeing, or even what will be able to happen in our church life and worship, week by week.

We have had to become used to lockdown, to greater working and studying at home, to wearing face masks and keeping our social distance, to being restricted as to when we can meet up with our wider family and friends, to conducting worship online and taking part in meetings on Zoom.

Life for us has quite suddenly taken on some of the precariousness and fragility that was familiar to the generations who went before us and who built many of the places of worship that we now cherish. We in the western world, perhaps rather naively, thought that we had moved on from, and escaped, the deprivations and challenges that had afflicted our ancestors (but which remain the characteristics of life to this day in many less developed, stable and privileged parts of the world). We had been encouraged to believe – or, at least, to act – as though we had 'come of age' and were in control of our destiny.

Now, however, the bubble has burst, the illusion has been shattered and our human vulnerability has become all too obvious to us and to those around us. Some of us have been ill, many have lost loved ones, and the caring professions have been under immense pressure.

As this has unfolded, online worship seems to have attracted greater numbers than had recently attended face-to-face worship, but whether that will lead to greater numbers of active disciples, we do not yet know.



However, whether or not our numbers have immediately increased, we ourselves have surely been chastened and challenged to recognise afresh our own need of God. We have been starkly reminded of what we really did know all along – that all that is around us is of a transitory nature, and that there is only One in whom to put our faith, and to whom our eternal wellbeing can be entrusted.

I wish you every blessing as we adapt to the evolving nature of the 'new normal', and as we seek to witness afresh to our unchanging and dependable God, and to his love for all people and his desire for them to be in a conscious living relationship with him.

For them and for ourselves, we pray:

The Lord bless you and watch over you, the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you, the Lord look kindly on you and give you peace;

that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world, may rest upon his eternal changelessness.

So another month or two of lockdown over, and although things are still cancelled we look forward to a time when we might be able to start things up again.

Sight Loss Friendly Church

A Christian charity that helps people with sight loss and churches who want to be more welcoming and understanding to people who have sight loss. It gives access to a whole load of resources to help us become more aware of what we can do for people with sight loss. Deliveries and foodbank

I'm still working at the foodbank two days a week now. On a Monday, being part of team preparing for the afternoon when people visit to collect their parcels, and on a Friday when we are still doing deliveries to those who can't get out. On Monday, the number of clients has significantly increased, we were getting about 6 each week, but this has been over 25 for a few weeks now. The deliveries have levelled out about 20 a week now, which is much more manageable as the delivery team have decreased due to people going back to work.

Money Support Centre

The money support centre is the new name for the debt advice service I have spoken about before. The change of name shows that we will be doing more that just debt advice.

We still haven't launched yet, please pray that we find a way working out all the practicalities of social distancing and meeting clients.

A quick update on FISH. Unfortunately we won't be able to run FISH again in October. As I write the government haven't agreed to run the voucher scheme again, but Michael Rashford is in the news again saying about holiday hunger and child poverty, so the decision may be reversed again. Please pray for those campaigning that the message is heard by the right people and those in government who make these decisions.

Pastoral Care

My pastoral care course came to quick end in March because we were no longer allowed to be trained on the final module, which I will do sometime next year. Our cohort are still being licensed throughout 26th September, and mine is at 3pm. Unfortunately we don't get a day out at the cathedral, it will all be done by wonderful zoom. Please pray for ways I can use pastoral care in the our group and our community.

Weston Favell Centre foodbank operates from the shop in the centre. We will continue as long as we have supplies.

foodbank operates on Mondays 10—1pm and Wednesdays 10-1pm

For everyone's protection and to comply with social distancing we ask that only one member of the household attends.

The unit is open to receive donations on Mon, Tues, Weds and Fri from 10 - 2pm

The Foodbank is closed on Thursdays.

Thank you for your support! August saw the foodbank figures decline to feeding approx. 1000 people. Deliveries have now stabilised at 20. During lockdown we were doing 60

We are working hard to ensure that people in need of the service are accessing it. In January we were feeding around 450 people per month. During lockdown we spiked in May at 1400 people and we are preparing ourselves should there be another spike in the Autumn as is expected.

The foodbank is now open on Friday mornings from 10 to 12pm. We hope this will spread out the demand for food parcels, and provide a more flexible walk in service for our local community. There has been a slow start but we expect it to increase in the same way that the Monday service has steadily increased.

Donations have been steady and we thank everyone who has donated so generously. We have become involved with more projects both in our local community and nationwide. Recently we have partnered with Food4Heroes to offer our foodbank guests the opportunity to have freshly prepared nutritionally balanced meals. They come in the form of containers to heat up in the microwave. Food4Heroes are also gifting our foodbank a fridge and a freezer to support this process. We are excited to be involved with this project, if it is successful it will be deployed nationwide

We have 20 volunteers approx, who keep the unit running smoothly. With the Social Distancing rules it can be difficult to find the right balance at times. We do have some gaps on Monday mornings and Tuesday afternoons when we are in need of volunteers to help in the preparation of food parcels.

You may have seen us on Look East, online and also heard us on local radio stations. We hope this will increases awareness of Weston Favell Foodbank, the numbers of people we are able to help and the need for continuing donations.

Thanks to all who have made donations or have volunteered their help. Without your support we would be unable to continue.

AND SPECIAL GRACE TO THEM, BECAUSE THEY GO THROUGH THE WORLD UNPROTECTED.



The Knife Angel is an imposing contemporary sculpture formed of 100,000 knives handed in to the Police or confiscated by Police.

During May and June next year, the sculpture will be a focal point for exhibitions, debates, action and prayer to tackle violence of any nature In Northamptonshire, especially knife crime, which is on the increase, and to spread the love of God.

The Knife Angel was created by artist Alfie Bradley and the British Ironworks Centre, based in Oswestry, England.

The Oberammergau Passion Play which had to be postponed this year due to Covid 19 has now been rescheduled for 2022.

The *Oberammergau Passion Play* has been performed every 10 years since 1634 by the inhabitants of the village of Oberammergau, Bavaria, Germany. The *2020* play has been delayed until May 2022 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The play was written by Othmar Weis, J A Daisenberger, Otto Huber, Christian Stuckl, Rochus Dedler, Eugen Papst, Marcus Zwink, Ingrid H Shafer, and the inhabitants of Oberammergau, with music by Dedler.

Since its first production it has been performed on open-air stages in the village. The text of the play is a composite of four distinct manuscripts dating from the 15th and 16th centuries. The play is a staging of Jesus' passion, covering the short final period of his life from his visit to Jerusalem and leading to his execution by crucifixion.




Lovely Greetings from Katrin & Micha Ulmer


Bangladesh
