# Journeying and trusting

# together this new year

Our church community along with so many others, has recently prayed the Methodist Covenant prayer together. In doing so we celebrate our relationship with God and affirm that we give over our day to day lives and choices to him.

The words of the prayer are deeply committal. They are indeed challenging -every line requires us to give over ourselves entirely. It's not easy to let go of our personal wants and desires; of our present and future plans and to place them in another's hands. Yet through these words we surrender ourselves to God and deny ourselves too. Jesus said ""If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23).

This prayer at the start of a new year begins a journey for us, a journey which involves learning to loosen our grip on the things that separate us from God, surrendering to him in love and joy.

It's all too easy for us to say this prayer with good intent and then to discard it and get on with our lives, but these words of prayer are the journey of a disciple. We must be and do. We are participants with Christ in his mission and restoration project. We must reflect him where we are by seeking to yield to him in love, joy, hope and humility. This requires us to listen to and know God's voice, which comes from growing in our relationship with God and one another.

We journey with Christ together, as a community and group of churches. The words of the covenant are expressed as "I" although we don't say them alone but together, as one body. On our journey with God, we support and care for one another. We can't do this Jesus way of life on our own. The Covenant prayer reminds us of what the Jesus way of life looks like, and what it is to love God with our whole heart, soul, and mind and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

When we let go and let God, we are liberated from the chains which bind us, whether that be power, control, lack of rest or others. Walking with the strength of God rather than our own, allows us to lovingly shed light and act on injustice and oppression in our communities.

In saying the covenant prayer together, we promise to live as a committed family of God and to reflect him in how we serve our church community, and local communities. We promise to enter Jesus' mission as his disciples and representatives in the world. This prayer describes Jesus' missional life of love-drenched self-giving and emptying that we are to emulate.

I read this prayer again and reflect on these challenging words, can I truly promise this? Can I commit to trusting God so completely? It is only in community that we can try to live and love this way- a community centred on the life and mission of Jesus, and this is why house groups or similar are important. This is why we must be community, not only at our Sunday worship gathering but during the week too.

It is with God and in community that we will learn how to walk in his strength, prayerfully and actively.

# February - the month for celebrating with candles and groundhogs!

For Christians throughout the world, February gets underway with Candlemas, a special celebration officially held on 2nd February, or the nearest Sunday to it. This year, according to the Church of England lectionary, it has been moved forward to Sunday 30th January, other denominations may be different.

Candlemas is also known as the 'Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple' and recalls the events recorded in the Gospel of Luke 2.22- 40. The ceremony described by Luke complied to the Old Testament Jewish rite of purification when, following the birth of a child the mother had to be 'purified' by offering a burnt offering in the Temple of a lamb, although for the poor, a young pigeon or dove was acceptable.

Candlemas is held 40 days after Christmas a length of time that is prescribed for most of the major events in the Christian calendar, for example the 40 days of Lent which this year begins on Ash Wednesday 2nd March, and what was originally, 40 days of Advent.

For some Christians around the world, it is still the time decorations are taken down. Today, however, it is more generally recognised that The Epiphany, which marks the visit by the magi, and which is celebrated 12 days after Christmas Day, is the time to take them down.

For many parish churches, Candlemas became the time when the new stock of candles arrived for the year and a feature of the service was for them to be blessed and dedicated to serve God. This was, of course, before electricity took over as the prime source of lighting. In recent times,



some churches have adapted Candlemas to incorporate Christingle, while other churches include Christingle in their pre-Christmas celebrations.

Another spin-off from the ancient Christian festival of Candlemas is Groundhog Day which is also on 2nd February. Groundhog Day is primarily a time for a family feast and party in North America. It has its roots in Germany and it reached America via Dutch speaking emigrees who took with them their superstitions about predicting spring.

Basically, this superstition says that if a groundhog emerges from its burrow on Candlemas Day and sees its shadow due to clear weather, it will retreat to its den and winter will persist for six more weeks; if it does not see its shadow because of cloudiness, spring will arrive early.

Like the St Swithin's Day superstition – which is on 15th July and predicts 40 days and 40 nights of rain if it rains on 15th. There is no real scientific evidence that supports the groundhog phenomenon, but this doesn't stop people enjoying themselves!

# Make St Valentine's Day memorable give a book!



The idea was started in 2012 and is now run entirely by volunteers in 44 countries. According to the National Literacy Trust, in 2012 only one in every eight children in the UK owned a book and today generally, literacy is still much lower than most of us would expect. The Covid lockdowns have slightly boosted the amount of reading that children have been doing, although much of this is not always with printed books – online activities and games were a prime source.

Perhaps one of the most important comments the Literacy Trust's latest report, published last year, is that: 'Some children and young people reported that a lack of access to books (with schools and libraries closed), a lack of quiet space at home and a lack of school/peer support had negatively affected their ability to read and their motivation to read for enjoyment'.

Although we approach God with dirty and spoilt lives, because of His love, we can shake hands with a holy God and share that love with others.



#### **Sad Statistics**

These yearly statistics demonstrate the increase in footfall at foodbank. over the last 3 years:

2019 = 5911 2020 = 120032021 = 13374



Numbers have slowed slightly during January; which is to be expected following the Christmas season, which is one of the busiest times of the year. We are expecting an increase in footfall during February and March as gas and electricity costs are due for a big increase and the cost of food is also on the increase.

No-one wants to have to come to Foodbank, so as well as providing food parcels, Community Law Service, Adult Social Services, Advice on financial matters and the new 'Look Up' job club are now available in Foodbank to give people advice and support to help them to see their way out of their crisis situation, improve their lives and make changes for the better.

We have re-opened on Fridays. This makes Foodbank more accessible to people but also

spreading the load over three openings takes some of the pressure from our volunteers'.

There will be another school uniform pop -up shop during the half term school holiday. Thurs 17th Feb. Donations of decent quality used uniform should be at Foodbank By Fri 11th Feb please.

Donations continue to come in. Thank you all, we couldn't exist without you!

The new Aldi in Moulton are one of the newest donors. When the store opens we will be picking up food from them three times a week.


Everyone has been asking about Sunday Lunches and afternoon teas. Hopefully these will resume in March. Just keep asking!

The recent death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu was mourned around the world. Here are five of his more famous quotes, which show why he was so especially honoured for his justice and reconciliation work in South Africa.

"Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world."

"If you are neutral in situations of injustice, you have chosen the side of the oppressor. If an elephant has its foot on the tail of a mouse, and you say that you are neutral, the mouse will not appreciate your neutrality."

"Don't raise your voice, improve your argument. Good sense does not always lie with the loudest shouters, nor can we say that a large, unruly crowd is always the best arbiter of what is right."

"Forgiving is not forgetting; it's actually remembering – remembering and not using your right to hit back. It's a second chance for a new beginning. And the remembering part is particularly important. Especially if you don't want to repeat what happened."

"Differences are not intended to separate; to alienate. We are different precisely in order to realise our need of one another."



# Saving the Planet via Kitchen and Bathroom in 2022

As world leaders wake up to the crisis of global warming and plan emergency measures before it is too late, each of us can make a difference right now, beginning in our own homes.

#### Start in the KITCHEN

25% of the world's food is thrown away. One supermarket discovered British households waste seven million tonnes of food waste every year, partly because most of our fridges aren't cold enough. Keeping the fridge temperature at a maximum of 4 degrees will help food last longer and save waste.

Vast quantities of greenhouse gases are released by animals reared to supply us with red meat and dairy products. Cutting down on quantities and conserving leftovers would help.

Conserving electricity by washing clothes at 30 degrees and replacing power-hungry tumble driers with a clothes line or old-fashioned clotheshorse would have the added advantage of reducing soaring power bills.

According to the Good Housekeeping Institute, "many mainstream detergents are brimming with synthetic chemicals like phosphates, chlorine and bleach that pollute our waterways, damaging delicate ecosystems, and may irritate sensitive skin." Plant-based and eco-friendly alternatives are now readily available and work well in the washing machine and dishwasher.

#### Don't forget the BATHROOM

Annual increases in UK water consumption would be curbed, if we were to shower rather than bath. Exchanging the shower head for a water-saving type, which regulates or aerates the flow, would save both water and cash.

Spending less time in the shower needn't be a hard-ship. Daily shampooing may actually be counter-productive – it's best to let some oils remain in the hair, so they can act as moisturisers. Biodegradable body wash is available in bulk, from which re-usable containers can be filled.

Eco-friendly toothpaste is now on the market, some of it in plastic-free containers. More water can be saved by turning the tap off as we brush. Beware wet-wipes which may be 'flushable', but aren't biodegradable, because they are part plastic. Eco-friendly alternatives are now available.

Saving the planet needn't cost the earth







On 6th February this year Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth.

To celebrate this unprecedented anniversary, events and initiatives will take place throughout the year, culminating in a four day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June. The bank holiday will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone.

The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years of service.

In addition, initiatives including 'The Queen's Green Canopy' and the 'Platinum Pudding competition' will create a lasting reminder of The Queen's Jubilee, while The Queen's private estates will also join in with special Jubilee themed events offering more opportunities for members of the public to celebrate the historic milestone.

#### **Get Baking!**

To mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee there is a nationwide baking competition. If you are a UK resident aged 8 and over you can apply to take part in the competition to create the perfect Platinum Pudding recipe dedicated to The Queen. Five finalists will prepare their pudding for an expert judging panel including Dame Mary Berry, Monica Galetti and Buckingham Palace Head Chef Mark Flanagan. The winning recipe will be made available to the public and the pudding enjoyed at Big Jubilee Lunches during the Jubilee weekend, and by generations to come.

#### **Get Planting!**

More than 60,000 trees have already been planted in the UK through The Queen's Green Canopy project in the two months since the planting season began. Communities and cities from Cornwall to Glasgow have come together to make 2022 a truly special year to "plant a tree for the Jubilee" as a celebration of The Queen's 70 years of service to the nation and the Commonwealth.

The Queen's Green Canopy is generating the planting of large, celebration trees, majestic avenues of trees, urban planting, and expansive new forests that will benefit future generations. Every planting is recorded on a digital Queen's Green Canopy map which will be presented to Her Majesty at the end of the Jubilee year.

The Queen's Green Canopy is also working to protect 70 ancient trees and woodlands that are a valuable part of the UK's heritage and history and launched a training programme to teach unemployed young people new skills in tree planting and management, and a Young Foresters Award to highlight the value of trees to school children. The Queen's Green Canopy will continue throughout 2022 and into March 2023.

#### Let's Create Platinum Jubilee Fund

The Let's Create Jubilee Fund is a £5 million programme that will support community and voluntary organisations in England to develop creative and cultural activities as part of the celebrations in June 2022.

Applicants will be able to apply for grants of up to £10,000 and are encouraged to partner with established artists, creatives and cultural organisations to develop their activities.


