# A month of celebration

eventy years on the throne: our Queen is an amazing woman, totally committed to duty, honour, country and commonwealth, and to her Christian faith. Although her accession to the throne was in February, this is the month of celebration, and the time for us to honour our Queen and to thank God for her.

Some people find public celebrations very easy, and love big events, street parties, mega concerts, and so on. Others prefer a quieter life. However, this is a unique national occasion, and we ought all to find ways to honour such a remarkable person and all that she has brought to our national life.

From the first weekend of the month to the last, and June is also the month when we ordain new deacons and priests in the Cathedral. Not every parish is directly involved, but it should be a great cause of rejoicing for all of us that men and women, younger and older, are continuing to offer themselves for ordination in healthy numbers.

Our selection process is quite rigorous, training takes several years, plus at least three years of on-the-job training as curates. It usually takes around eight years from someone first offering until they can be in charge of a parish or in an unsupervised chaplaincy role. Even through lockdown, we have had a steady stream of good candidates, and the future looks promising in terms of the



availability of future clergy.
In the middle of June, among other things, I will be presiding at confirmations, instituting a new vicar in a parish, dedicating major refurbishments in another church, spending a day in a rural multiparish benefice including a school visit, spending a morning with the group of people training to be licensed as Lay Ministers and Readers later in the year.

In one way, these are just standard, "bread and butter" activities in my diary: but they are also signs of a church that is truly alive. That is something more to celebrate. Praise God!

I have some good news, my contract has been extended, what an answer to prayer, thank you all who were involved in extending and finding the funding.


### **FISH**

## This month the Queen makes history by celebrating her **Platinum Jubilee.** 70 years in the job!

We join with millions across Britain and the Commonwealth who thank God for Queen Elizabeth's dedication, wisdom, and steadfastness over the past seven decades.



A special extended bank holiday weekend this month will give communities across the UK a chance to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. In February this year, HM the Queen became the first British monarch to celebrate 70 years of service.

The weekend, from Thursday June 2<sup>nd</sup> to Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> will include a birthday parade, beacons across the country, a 'platinum party' at Buckingham Palace, a pageant and thousands of street parties and lunches.

Many churches will be holding special services and events. A centrepiece of the celebrations will be a Service of Thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral, London, on Friday June 3<sup>rd</sup>. It is fitting that the service will form a key part of the Jubilee, as the Queen has been vocal in speaking about her Christian faith in a series of high-profile broadcasts.

In her Christmas Day broadcast in 2016, she said: "Jesus Christ lived obscurely for most of his life, and never travelled far. He was maligned and rejected by many, though he of England but her had done no wrong. And yet billions of people now follow his teaching and find in him the guiding light for their lives.

"I am one of them, because Christ's example helps me see the value of doing small things with great love, whoever does them and whatever they themselves believe."

Journalist Catherine Butcher, who wrote 'Our Faithful Queen – 70 years of faith and service' to mark the Platinum Jubilee, recalls: "The Queen Mother subscribed to daily devotional Bible reading notes. She regularly read Bible stories to the young princesses, Elizabeth and Margaret and taught them to pray.

Both girls started their weekly school lessons with half an hour of Bible reading, under the guidance of their governess, and weekly church attendance has been a lifelong pattern for the Queen, who is said to keep a well-read Bible by her bedside."

Catherine Butcher tells how evangelist Billy Graham wrote in this autobiography, 'Just as I am' about meeting the Queen on several occasions. He said: "I always found her very interested in the Bible and its message."

The Queen is Supreme Governor of the Church interest in faith goes well beyond this title. She holds a strong Christian faith and has



exemplified this in her lifetime of dedicated service.

Throughout 2021, WFC Foodbank received 4,678 referrals for emergency food provision for 1,014 households.

This has continued to increase during the first months of 2022, with 1,608 referrals being received on behalf of 591 households – that is over half of the whole of last year, in the first 15 weeks of this year.!



We are expecting that the increased demand will continue for the foreseeable future as more and more people can't afford the essentials - and looking to the year ahead, it is likely that we will become even busier as everyone is impacted by the current cost-of-living crisis.

The rising cost of living is impacting on everyone and the foodbank is very grateful to people continuing to donate enabling us to continue to feed those in need.



We are currently feeding 1300 people a month on average, although this figure is rising. This is a huge pressure on foodbank to consistently support this number of foodbank users.

To maximise resources we are cutting costs and promoting the need for donations to foodbank where ever we can. We are also exploring improved efficient and effective ways of working.



## Archbishop calls for the Government to work with faith groups to achieve net zero carbon

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has called on the Government to work with faith groups to achieve net zero carbon.

Speaking recently in the House of Lords during a debate on Behaviour Change for Net Zero, he said: "My Lords, like the Government, the Church of England has targets for reaching net-zero carbon, in our case by 2030.

"Churches across the Anglican Communion are deeply affected by climate change. We are working right across the Communion on this question.



# The Knife Angel Visits Northampton



I am CEO of C2C Social Action. We work with women and men across Northamptonshire who are in or on the edges of the criminal justice system. We aim to enable people to change their lives by breaking the cycle of offending, poverty and rehabilitation through changes in thoughts, behaviours and life styles that brought them into the criminal justice system

Time and time again, the people we work with have experienced violence and aggression in their home or community to the extent where it almost starts to feels normal to them. And all too often they carry that behaviour with them into adulthood, and their own relationships, which is why many of our service users have experienced domestic abuse. Sadly, their children are also at risk of being drawn into this cycle of violence and aggression.

The Knife Angel, the national monument against violence and aggression, was going to tour the country. It was originally booked to visit Northampton in June 2020. However, like so many other things, due to the Covid Pandemic, the tour was cancelled for 2020 and 2021.

The Angel comes with great responsibility! Apart from the obvious one of keeping it safe, we are also required to provide 28 days of youth engagement, addressing anti-violence and anti-aggression across the county.

We have been working with NN off the streets, Police engagement teams, local football clubs, council safety teams, schools and community groups to produce educational materials that send this message.

We have developed schemes of work, podcasts, worksheets, school visits and workshops, as well as encouraging 10,000 people to sign up to be anti violence ambassadors.

To me the angel is asking why....

It's made of 100,000 knives that were handed in during a knife amnesty. Some of the knives had blood stains on them and had to be decontaminated before they were added to the knife angel.

At that time, our own Detective Superintendent Dennis Murry had the privilege to hand over some knives from the amnesty in this county.

He, himself, took time to be part of the construction of the Knife Angel and welded some of the knives in place





I hope that the stories shared by those that have been affected by knife crime will be heard by the wider community and that those stories will touch the lives of others, encouraging them to think about the lives that have been lost or changed due to the knife.

Although we only have the Knife angel for the month of May, I hope and pray that all the partnership working, programs, and activities that have been put together, will stand as a lasting legacy in the call to stand against violence and aggression in the county. Let's take knives off the streets of Northamptonshire, not just for May 2022, but for good, and my hope is that this is the start of the conversation.

## Living in love and faith

The Church of England is keenly aware that issues of gender and sexuality are intrinsic to people's experience; their sense of identity; their lives and the loving relationships that shape and sustain them.

We also know that the life and mission of our Church - and of the worldwide Anglican Communion - are affected by the deep, and sometimes painful, disagreements among us which have been debated and discussed on many occasions over the years.

These divisions have come into sharper focus because of society's changing perspectives and practices, especially in relation to lesbian, gay, transgender, bisexual and intersex people.

The Church wants to understand what it means to follow Christ in love and faith given the questions about human identity and the variety of patterns of relationship emerging in our society, including marriage, civil partnership, cohabitation, celibacy and friendship. (LLF course book)

You may recall receiving an invitation to participate in this Lent course, which was run by St Peter's Church, Weston Favell via Zoom. The materials used were produced by the Church of England and included videos of people living in love and faith in differing types of relationships. They spoke about their experiences of trying to remain true to their Christian belief whilst being part of a relationship, which may be regarded by some as difficult to accept.

Now as we lead the Church of England into making whatever decisions are needed for our common life regarding matters of identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage, we appeal to you to join is in this period of discernment. (LLF course book)

Doug, Precious and I attended the course together with 25+ people from St Peter's. Each of the five sessions followed a similar pattern of prayer, videos about relationship, Bible study and discussion in small groups.

The five sessions dealt with these themes: What does it mean to learn together as followers of Jesus Christ?

How does our identity in Christ relate to sex and gender?

What kinds of relationships does God call us to

Where do our bodies and sex fit in to all of this? How do diversity and difference affect our life together as a church?


Four were led by a Reader from St Peter's, the final one by their Curate. From the outset it was clear that mutual respect and confidentiality were paramount: if anyone found any topic distressing there was access to a private conversation with one of the leaders or clergy.

We found each session stimulating and challenging. Some of the information shared in the relationship videos, made us reflect on our own reactions. The videos showed people speaking openly about both the sadness and joy they had experienced in churches' reactions to their particular style of living together.

Doug, Precious and I are glad that we participated in the Living in love and faith course. It was beneficial to be guided in our consideration of such important aspects of life. All churches have had an opportunity to take part in this period of discernment and hopefully many churches and individuals have completed the questionnaire to provide feedback to the Church of England, which will be used to decide any future changes.

The deadline for responses is past. However, if you are interested in looking at the materials, they are available on both the Diocese of Peterborough and Church of England websites.

Its now been a year since I was elected to both the unitary and Town Councils. I have learnt a lot over the past year and I'm still adjusting to this new season. Sometimes the responsibilities weigh so imporheavily on my shoulders but then I remember that I hold it lightly in the power given to us as followers of Jesus.

This past month has been mainly about the Knife Angel visit to the county. Angie Kennedy CEO of C2C Social Action and a member of our Church has been doing incredible work on the visit.

Knife crime and violence is sadly ever present, fear of it is greater than actual incidents but there are issues that need resolving.

There are so many issues, some many problems, a number of opportunities and its easy to be pulled in multiple directions. Listening for the leading of the Holy Spirit into the few things I'm called to do is

important. Investing in our young people is tant. I recognise






Pray also for me, and for us that we would fully reflect the image that is ours in Christ Jesus as lights in the darkness bringing hope and a future.
