The Rt Revd John Holbrook announced as Acting Bishop

The Rt Revd John Holbrook, Bishop of Brixworth will be Acting Bishop for the Diocese of Peterborough when Bishop Donald retires in January, it has been announced.

Bishop John was installed as the Bishop of Brixworth in 2011 and serves as sponsoring bishop, working with the Diocesan Director of Ordinands on discerning people's call to ordained ministry.



He has ovesight of retired clergy who have been given permission to officiate (PTO). He also cares for those working in chaplaincy roles, such as hospitals, prisons, schools or sports clubs. He regularly undertakes parish mission weekends.

He will continue in this role as well as taking responsibility for the diocese until a new diocesan bishop is appointed.

Accepting the new position Bishop John said: 'I am delighted to be invited to lead the Diocese through the coming year. We have a superb senior team and I look forward to continuing to work alongside them.'

Bishop Donald announced his intention to retire in July and will step down as the Bishop of Peterborough at a farewell service in the Cathedral on Sunday 8 January.

Bishop John will be supported in his new role by the Archbishop's Commissary, the Rt Revd Jonathan Meyrick. Bishop Jonathan was formerly Suffragan Bishop of Lynn in Norwich Diocese and has, since 2021, been an Honorary Assistant Bishop in the Peterborough Diocese.

Following his appointment of Bishop John as Acting Bishop, and with Bishop Jonathan as Commissary, Bishop Donald said: 'I am confident that, with our existing senior staff and office staff, they will be able to give a good lead during the coming year'.

This prayer was read at the Remembrance Service at Boothville. If you have a poppy use it as you pray if not just picture it in your mind.


First, we hold one of the petals of the poppy.
Father, the red of the petal is like the red of the blood shed by so many in the wars of the last century. We remember members of our family who were directly involved with those wars, some in the armed forces some left behind. We remember injury, trauma, death, courage, fear – lives changed forever. We give thanks for so many who were prepared to pay the highest price of all....

Now we take hold of another petal on our poppy. In doing so, we hold before God the violence and warfare of our own times – the simmering violence, the open hostilities and the threat of terrorism everywhere. We pray, Father, that you give us politicians and military leaders equal to the huge tasks they face – wise in judgement, calm in spirit, makers of peace.

Now we touch the centre of the poppy, the place where the seeds are kept, ready for new life. Lord, take the seeds of peace that lie in the hearts of your people everywhere and cast them generously over every continent and nation. Let those seeds germinate, grow and flourish. Beat our swords into ploughshares, our spears into pruning hooks and our weapons of mass destruction into technologies of peace.

Now we hold the green leaf (or green stem) and remember the green and growing hope that comes from faith alone, faith in a God for whom everything is possible, even in the darkest hour. May hope guide our politics, our nation, our thinking and our lives. May hope draw us ever nearer to that day when the world shall be filled with the glory of God as the waters cover the sea.

Lord in your mercy, forgive out foolish ways, In your mercy help us listen before we fight, In your mercy, hold back the men of war, In your mercy, save the innocent, In your mercy hear us, in your mercy, in your mercy.

We had lunch at the Lumbertubs Pub and coffee at Boothville hall before boarding a coach for Peterborough. Precious is writing about the day in this edition of Bert but just to say it was a wonderful occasion and Precious looked radiant.

Later in November we celebrated Precious's 60th birthday at Boothville. Precious wore the dress she had made for her induction at the cathedral and provided us all with a buffet lunch. She received a bouquet of flowers and cards from the congregation.

Still looking

We have seen a decrease in people visiting us over the last few months since we moved the unit to temporary premises. (Emmanuel & Moulton Park) In October we fed 926 people compared to 1339 in September. This could partly be down to our move and some people not knowing where we are now but also we referred our guests to alternative foodbanks while we were closed and possibly some of them have stayed with those food-

banks.

We were also forced to change our opening times and cut out the Monday session altogether, so we are now only



open on Wednesday and Friday. We are really keen to reinstate the three sessions per week when we find suitable permanent premises that will house both the foodbank and our warehouse.

We have had harvest festival recently and quite a few food donations so we haven't had to purchase any food stocks in October which is also partly down to the lower footfall. Tesco continue to be a big donor, their collection baskets really work well.

Donations for Christmas Treats

Northampton High School are collecting advent calendars and selection boxes for us.

We had a tombola stall in WFC recently and raised approx. £70 This was part of the fundraising we are doing for toys for the children at Christmas.

We are also having a Christmas Raffle which is being drawn by Sally Keeble at the volunteers 'thank you' tea on 7th December.

We realise that the rising cost of living is impacting on everyone and so foodbank is extremely grateful to people continuing to donate, enabling us to continue to feed those in need.

To maximise resources we are cutting costs and promoting the need for donations to foodbank where ever we can.






Monday Night Prayer

What is the Eco Church group?

The group is made up of people that care about the environment.

We believe that part of our responsibilities as Christians is to look after all forms of God's Creation and to advocate for others to do the same.

It is at a time of enormous change in the UK with a new King and a new Prime Minister in place. Our environment is also changing around us faster than some scientists predicted, as we've seen with devastating consequences in Pakistan and elsewhere.

Thankfully, we believe in a God who is unchanging, the same yesterday, today and forever, and it is with this framing that we celebrate God's creation and are prompted to act to protect it.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

When you buy meat and fish

take your own airtight food container into shops and supermarkets to cut out the plastic packaging.

Wrap parcels the old-fashioned way - in brown paper, tie with string then secure with sealing wax, rather than using sticky tape.

Save power

Turn off lights when not needed, run your washing machine at 30 degrees, install double//triple glazing or thick curtains, insulate the roof.

Don't leave your TV on standby.

Refuse plastic wherever you can.

Say 'No, thank you' to any single -use plastic items, from cutlery to straws – in shops and food outlets and explain why.

Cut coffee-cup waste by carrying your own reusable cup eg. bamboo and corn travel mugs, with earth-friendly silicone lids.

Invest in a refillable glass water bottle and carry your own reusable straw for juices eg. bamboo or silicone drinking straws

Use organic cotton face/hand cloths

Rather than wet wipes or make-up remover pads and <u>never</u> put wipes down the loo.

Made of polyester, a plastic that takes years to degrade & releases millions of tiny fibres into rivers. The Dept for Environment now classes wipes as a serious environmental hazard.

As Bishop Donald said my name, Lay Canon Maureen Precious Luke, I had to hold back the tears as one of my favourite scriptures filled my heart. "Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God [set aside self-righteous pride], so that He may exalt you [to a place of honour in His service] at the appropriate time" 1Peter 5: 6 (Amplified Bible)

When I was 50, I was licensed as a Lay Reader. At 60 I am now a Lay Canon and I am excited about what God has in store for my future.


