Have you ever stopped to think about how AMAZING GOD IS?

The Bible reminds us of His greatness, His love, His promises and His faithfulness. Everything He does is awe-inspiring and though we don't always understand God's ways, we know that God's love for us is unchangeable because He is the same **YESTERDAY**, **TODAY** and **FOREVER**. I want to share some key aspects that make our God amazing.

GOD IS THE CREATOR OF THE UNIVERSE:

The sheer magnitude and complexity of the universe, from the galaxies to the ant, point to our amazing God. Isaiah 40: 28 "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary and his understanding no one can fathom." God's creativity is a testament to His greatness and wisdom.

GOD HAS UNLIMITED POWER:

God as omnipotent (all-powerful). He possesses unlimited power. The Bible describes numerous instances where God demonstrates His power, such as the parting of the Red Sea for the Israelites to pass through on dry ground and the feeding of over 5,000 people with 5 loaves and 2 fish. In Ephesians 3: 20 we see the following: "Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work in us, to Him be glory in the church." This power is seen as evidence of God's amazing nature and His ability to accomplish anything.

GOD DEMONSTRATES UNCONDITIONAL LOVE:

One of our foundational principals as Christians is that God is love. Romans 5: 8 "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." When we were unlovable, Christ loved us enough to die for us. This demonstrates that God's love is not based on anything that we have done or will do, but purely on His Grace. The depth and extent of God's love is remarkable and awe-inspiring.

GOD HAS INFINITE WISDOM:

This is not just wisdom, but wisdom that is immeasurable, and unlimited. Proverbs 2: 6 encourages us: "For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding." God's understanding exceeds ours, we can't get our heads around it, but thankfully, as we nurture our relationship with God, through His Word and through prayer, He guides and directs us. This wisdom is seen as extraordinary and worthy of admiration.

REDEMPTION AND FORGIVENESS:

God offers redemption and forgiveness to all who seek Him. Through Jesus' sacrifice, God provides a way for us to be reunited with Him and receive eternal life. 1 John 1: 9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." This act of grace and mercy is seen as extraordinary, demonstrating God's amazing love and desire for relationship with His creation.

GOD DEMONSTRATES TRANSFORMATIVE POWER:

God can bring about transformative change in our lives through the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15: 13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." We experience spiritual growth, healing, and empowerment. This transformative power is seen as evidence of God's amazing ability to bring about positive change in our lives.

As I write, I am reminding myself that my God who holds the universe in His hands, wants to have a relationship with me. It is not exclusive....He wants to have a relationship with each of us. My prayer is that we open our hearts, let Him in and see how AMAZING GOD IS.



rainbows Brightening short lives

On 9th July Boothville Community Choir held their summer concert. As usual, it was a sell - out, enjoyed by all. This time it was in support of the Rainbow Children's Hospice.

The Hospice provides care and support for babies, children and young people with serious and terminal conditions, and their whole family, across the East Midlands.

The care they offer is wide ranging; palliative care and end of life care, symptom management, emergency care, respite and short breaks and is available in the Hospice, at home and in hospitals.

They support every baby, child and young person to fulfil their potential, and help families make the most of every precious moment, while capturing memories and keepsakes to treasure.

You may well expect the Hospice to be a sad place but actually children live in the moment, they don't worry about what happens next and that makes the Hospice a bright and happy place where the children, and their families have fun together.

The concert raised £745.38 on the night but this amount was matched by an anonymous donor, so the final amount was £1490.76 — what a wonderful result!

The Transfiguration

This month we celebrate Jesus' transfiguration, when Jesus took Peter, John and James with Him up a mountain to pray (Luke 9:28-36). Jesus was transfigured alongside Moses and Elijah: 'As He was praying, the appearance of His face changed, and His clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning.' (29).

Watch

The disciples' eyes were opened, as Jesus' hidden divinity was revealed. The presence of Moses and Elijah confirmed Him as God's promised Messiah, who fulfilled God's plan and purposes. By foreshadowing the cross, resurrection and ascension, this event powerfully calls us to entrust our lives into Jesus' hands to experience His presence and power.

Listen

There came a voice from the cloud covering them: 'This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to Him.' (35). God affirmed His love and call on Jesus, as His beloved and chosen Son. This is the second time God spoke audibly about Jesus (Luke 3:22), but on this occasion He was speaking for the benefit of the disciples. Do we hear God speaking these same words to us? We listen to what Jesus says to us, knowing that like Him we are deeply loved and accepted by God.

The Disciples Response: Learn!

The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen' (36). They were impacted by this experience and needed time to reflect on what they had seen and heard about Jesus. Eight days before they were asked by Jesus: 'Who do you say I am?' (Luke 9:20). In the transfiguration their understanding of Jesus was being transformed. As we reflect on Jesus' ministry, to encounter the real Jesus, we are also transformed.

What is the Eco Church group?

The group is made up of people that care about the environment.

We believe that part of our responsibilities as Christians is to look after all forms of God's Creation and to advocate for others to do the same.

Eco-Friendly Living Tips

Whether you're going green to save money, improve your health, or help the environment, every step towards eco-friendly living is a step in the right direction. If you're new to the concept of eco-friendly living, then you might not know where to start. Don't be discouraged. Adopting an eco-friendly lifestyle is a journey that will take time to adjust to.

Ditch Single-use Plastic

Single-use plastic is everywhere, especially in our kitchens, but reducing your dependence on single-use plastic is easier than you might think. Bringing a reusable cotton tote when you go shopping and purchasing loose fruits and veggies will significantly reduce the plastic in your home. You can also stop buying bottled water. Instead, take a reusable water bottle everywhere you go.

Buy Eco-Friendly Products

If you want to adopt eco-friendly living principles, you'll need to start shopping more carefully. Try searching for environmentally conscious companies that sell eco-friendly living products, such as reusable water bottles and plastic-free cleaning products. Other eco-friendly products to look out for include natural toiletries and alternatives to single-use plastics.

Repair, Reuse, Recycle

You've probably heard of the Three R's before, but do you use them in your daily life? If something is broken, get it repaired instead of throwing it away. If something can't be fixed, can you upcycle it? find another use for it? Remember; recycling is an energy-intensive process. So, always repair and re-use before recycling.

Drive Less

When possible, travel by public transport, car-share, cycle, run or walk, instead of driving. You can reduce your environmental impact by driving less. People who live on public transport routes or near a city centre may not need a car at all. Alternatively, choose a fuel-efficient or electric vehicle when you need to drive. Make sure you inflate the tyres properly and reduce your speed to the optimum level for your car.

Reduce Food Waste

We waste millions of tonnes of food every year. Apart from wasting our money, throwing out tons of food leads to increased greenhouse gases released from landfill sites. Storing fresh produce correctly can help you reduce the amount of food you waste. So get a set of reusable food storage containers. Try putting your leftovers from dinner into a reusable food pot and eating them for lunch the next day.

Eat Less Meat

You don't have to switch to a 100% plant-based diet to live an eco-friendlier lifestyle. But reducing the amount of meat on your plate, particularly red meats, is one of our eco-friendly living tips.

It's no secret that animal agriculture is highly unsustainable. and a major contributor to greenhouse gas emissions. What's more, regularly eating low-quality meats isn't great for your health. Taking meat off the menu a few days a week will help to keep the planet clean and your body healthy.

Switch to Renewable Energy

Renewable energy is now widely available and highly affordable. Switching to a 100% renewable energy supplier may save you money and help you live more sustainably. Plus, if you own your property, installing solar panels on your roof lets you benefit from free electricity!

Shop Locally

Clothes, food, electronics, anything! The closer to home you buy your products, the fewer miles they will have to travel. Transporting food and other commercial products increases their carbon footprint. So, support your local economy and buy locally produced goods whenever you can.


Eliminate the single-use plastics that you use away from home. Saying no to disposable plastics can be challenging, but it's easy if you're organised.

Say no to on-the-go plastics, travel with a refillable water bottle and take an insulated travel coffee mug whenever you want a takeaway coffee. Bring your own reusable bag, buy snacks in recyclable packaging, or sit to eat instead of getting a take-away.

Grow Your Own

Growing fruits and vegetables at home is a rewarding way to reduce your carbon footprint and save money. If you have a back garden or an allotment, you're already set to grow!

Growing your own food isn't limited to homeowners though. Anyone living in an apartment or renting a flat short-term can try growing herbs, shallow-rooted veggies such as spring onions, lettuce, and leeks, or fast-growing fruits like strawberries and raspberries. All you need is some window boxes, hanging baskets or small pots.



Japan has declared a natural disaster after a heatwave swept the country, killing at least 65 people.

Last week, a weather station at Ouargla, Algeria, in the Sahara desert, recorded a temperature of 51.3C, which is the highest reliable temperature ever recorded in Africa.

The global climate adviser for Christian Aid, Richard Ewbank, said "there is a global trend towards both high humidity heatwaves that result in high day and night temperatures, leaving vulnerable people such as the elderly particularly exposed to heat stress, and dry heatwaves that increase drought stress and wildfire occurrence".

Evidence that climate change is responsible for amplifying the intensity of heatwaves is increasing, Mr Ewbank said. "Globally, June was the second warmest on record, and the year to date has been the hottest La Niña (an ocean-atmosphere phenomenon) year on record."

NEWS FROM THE CAFE

She hopes to reintroduce Sunday Lunches and afternoon teas as soon as she has settled back in. These will need to be booked through the café as before. Dates will be announced soon after her return.

The Coffee Shop, and Church have now secured grants to cover admin costs, spread over 3 years, so that we can offer support to people in the community. Anna Austin is our new Community Support Worker for Café Emm. She started work in July. The Monday games sessions have been led by Pat Acock, and we thank her for her help. New members are needed, just come into Café Emm on Mondays at 10.00 and you will be made very welcome. We hope the memory café and 'singing for the brain' will also be revived shortly. Anna has some exciting new ideas and is busy putting them in place. More details will be available shortly.


