A Hopeful, Hope - filled Goodbye



Dear friends.

I am writing to you to say goodbye. May 1st will be my last Sunday with The Emmanuel Group of Churches, after almost eight years here, before I move on to a new role with The Diocese of Peterborough.

It has been an amazing, life-altering period of time here, first as Assistant Curate and then as Team Rector with so much change and development, both in me and in the Group of Churches. I'm grateful to God and grateful to you all for the opportunity and privilege it has been to minister here and be amongst you all for these years. I'm sad to be moving on but also excited for all that is to come, both for me and for you as a family of faith where there is always room for one more.

A Church or Group of Churches ought never to be reliant on a minster or team. The Church is the Lord's and, hopefully everything in it, and exists for His glory and for the good of the community which it is invited to love and to serve. I will enjoy watching from a relative distance what God does next with and through Emmanuel. Be assured of my prayers and that I'll be cheering you on. I'd value your prayers as I take on a new and what looks like quite substantial task, too.

I'm writing this to you in Lent, a season traditionally focused on sacrifice and self-denial. Neither of these concepts are fashionable, either in Church or in our Western culture at the moment, it seems to me. We want what we want when we want it and how we want it, in the way we want it.

Our desires and preferences can be for many things, from types of food, to music, to the way elements of our Church services run, but you may have found over the years, like me, that however humble and willing to be sacrificial you might say you are, or wish to be, it's usually not too difficult to find the one thing that we're still clinging on for, not willing to let go of or is the hill on which, as the modern saying goes, we're willing to die.

For some it might be that the chairs in Church ought to be a certain way round, that we always sit in the same one, or something more important. But I've been questioning myself a lot recently about those moments when my hackles get up about particular issues: Is it God asking me to stand for things that are right and good, or is it me and my own self-importance getting in the way again?

It can be hard to know the difference sometimes, but I think it is important that we take the time to check, and Lent is a good time for that. There might well be lots of reasons for this but I'll let you in on a secret as I get ready to depart the Emmanuel scene.. I'm not always right. Staggering I know... I'll let you in on another one: neither are any of us. How can we cope with such startling revelations?

Prayer, prayer, more prayer, reading the Bible, worshipping God together. Whether it's in a style or following a tradition we prefer or not, welcoming the stranger, being actually and truly hospitable to all, enjoying the similarities and differences we share and prayer, prayer and yet more prayer.

Easy when it's written out in a quick and handy guide, isn't it.

As we move through Lent and towards Easter, the hill on which Jesus willingly submitted to die comes ever more clearly into view. Ultimately, it's His life, death and resurrection which God invites us to focus on. It's his sacrifice, his laying aside of everything but love, for God, for humanity and for creation which can form the pattern for our lives if we choose to let it, and Him. One of the greatest gifts of God is that He does not force His way of life on us, but invites us to choose it.

As Easter comes closer, let's choose the way of love, the way of the Cross, the way of hope. There isn't another way to live which will fill us with joy, hope, love and peace, nor one which will enable us to both experience fullness of joy in the presence of God and invite others to do the same too. After all, that's what Emmanuel, God with us, ought really to be about most of all: life with God and the life of God shared with others.

So as I say a hopeful goodbye, thank you to God for his kindness over many years. Thank you to all of you who have been part of these years we've shared together. Please do love one another, take care of one another and serve well the communities God has given us to live in together.

Kindness wins, love wins, Jesus wins, as we remember at Easter especially, but which is true all of the time and will be forever.





Financial Report-2021

Covid 19 continued to have an impact on various aspects of Income indices on the Emmanuel Group of Churches budget

There were once again losses against budget due to Covid in 2021:

£9,737.00 on Lettings, £13,417.00 on Giving

and £4,500 on Coffee Shop Rent -

this was countered to some degree by savings on Utilities, due to lack of use of the building.

The above reflects performance against budget forecast figures, which once again

was set in the midst of an uncertain knowledge of how Omicron would affect 2021.

All giving from the three Congregations of Emmanuel Group of Churches

Emmanuel Church + 6.1% on 2020

Boothville Community Church + 3.1% on 2020 Rectory Farm Community Church +2.4% on 2020 Overall as a group of Churches +4.5% on the year 2020.

Despite the problems of 2021, I am pleased to advise that we paid 100% of our Parish Share in 2021. We also paid the full Methodist Assessment for 2021.

A great deal of credit in achieving these figures should go to Julie Parsons our excellent Fundraiser. She has once again

raised a staggering amount of money in 2021. Without her efforts and the continued amazing generosity of congregational members and those people not directly associated with Emmanuel Group of Churches, we would not be in the position we are now.

Considering the uncertainty of 2021, I feel privileged to have been your Treasurer and to have played a small part in what is a remarkable achievement, for which prayerful thanks should be given.

At December end 2019 our Free Funds stood at £733.00 At December end 2020 our Free Funds stood at £21,460.00 At December end 2021 our Free Funds stood at £14,456.00

The above is a testament to all involved from Ministers, Paid Members of staff and the host of willing volunteers who all work and strive for the benefit and glory of God's work in the Emmanuel Group of Churches.

I would also wish to thank Meriel Mears, who in 2021 took on the role of Assistant Treasurer and Gift Aid Secretary, as well as doing the Monthly Payroll.

My thanks also to the Finance Team for their excellent support in 2021

Safeguarding

This is an update on the safeguarding situation and how you can help to keep everything in good order.

Firstly, I confirm that I will be retiring at the end of January 2023 after around 13 years in this role. I have to say that the work involved has changed dramatically over these years particularly with the addition of the Foodbank; Family Tots; more vulnerable adults working as volunteers in the coffee shop and several community groups organised by Paul Foster.

This means there are more issues being referred to me, some of which are quite complicated. Which also means that some need to be reviewed regularly. There is much more paperwork with the Safeguarding Policy having to be reviewed every year and the number of police checks has also increased far beyond the number I first had to make sure where completed.

Training requirements are also completely different, with different roles having to complete different levels of training; all of which needs to be kept up to date, ensuring that everyone does the right training and also keeps everything current.

For your information, the Self-Declaration is at the end of the on-line application. It has to be filled in, printed off and handed to me or Paul Foster at the same time as the application is sent. It is for people to declare if there is anything that will show up on their DBS or not. When It is handed in at the same time as the application is sent and there is anything untoward, I can discuss it with the person before I see it on the notification of application. If I do not

have it, and there is an issue, it immediately raises concerns about why, whatever it is, has not been declared. It is as important as the DBS itself. I usually have spare copies of this form in my office.

Here is where you can help.

If you are in a role within the church that requires a police check and safeguarding training, please <u>take responsibility</u> to ensure that you know when you need to re-do your DBS and training and contact the Safeguarding Coordinator to set this in motion. Please also remember to hand in your self-declaration at the same time.

Currently, I think, myself and only around five other people in the group of churches actually does instigate their renewal at the moment. It really is your responsibility to ensure that these checks and appropriate training are carried out and it would have certainly made my job a lot easier if this had happened. It is particularly important with a new Safeguarding Coordinator coming on board, who may well assume that, as adults, we do individually make sure all our paperwork/safeguards are in place. So, please make sure you know where your Certificates are so you can ensure that your checks and training are always up to date.

Thank you for all that you do to contribute to Emmanuel Group of Churches' ministry.

Foodbank continues to be busy as gas and electricity costs are due for a big increase and the cost of food is also on the increase. Footfall increases as the months progress. This has meant we needed to open on Fridays, so now foodbank is open for 3days per week. Opening on Fridays makes Foodbank more accessible to people but also spreads the load over three openings takes some of the pressure from our volunteers'. Last Friday we had 29 families through the doors in 2 hours.

As well as providing food, on Wednesdays Community Law Service, Adult Social Ser-



vices, Advice on financial matters and the new 'Look Up' job club are now available in Foodbank to give people advice and support to help them to see their way out of their crisis situation, improve their lives and make changes for the better.

Look out for more school uniform pop-up shops. Or, if it's urgent, ask at foodbank.

Donations of decent quality used uniform will be much appreciated. Donations continue to come in. Thank you all, we couldn't exist without you!

What is the Eco Church group?

The group is a team of people that care about the environment and how we, as individuals and as a church, affect it. We believe that part of our responsibilities as Christians is to look after God's Creation in all forms and to advocate for others to do the same.

Why have we set up the group?

It was felt by a number of people that as a church we could be more environmentally minded and sustainable and that a specific group to look into this would be helpful. A proposal to have an Eco Church Group and to be part of the wider Eco Church Scheme was sent to Emmanuel Group Council and given the approval to go ahead. The Church of England, Methodist and Baptist Church all support churches being part of the Eco Church Scheme to help improve churches' sustainability and environmental impact.

What is the Eco Church Scheme?

The Eco Church Scheme was launched by the Christian charity A Rocha in 2016.

It is an award scheme

'designed to assist and inspire churches to embed creation care throughout the whole of Church life' (from Rocha website).

There are five areas of the scheme: Worship & Teaching

Management of Church Buildings (if applicable)

Management of Church Land (if applicable)

Community and Global Engagement

Lifestyle

Initially a questionnaire is completed to assess each area of our church. The result will tell us if we are already eligible for an award or what we need to do to achieve an award. There are Bronze, Silver and Gold Eco Awards.

The aim is not specifically to achieve an award but to make changes to include creation care in our everyday lives. However the awards are a nice way to demonstrate the changes that have been made.

What will the group do?

The remit of the group will evolve as it develops. Firstly we need to assess how environmentally friendly our Church is by completing the Eco Church Assessment. The result will highlight areas which we can work on improving. We also intend to create an environmental policy for our group of churches.

Going forward the group aims to encourage and support the congregation and users of the church to be more Eco minded and to make sustainable changes as well as helping ensure that <u>creation care</u> is an integral part of teaching and study within the church year.

Will this involve all three congregations?

The aim is to include all three congregations of Emmanuel Group. It would be wonderful to have representatives from all three congregations on the Eco Church group.

We will also aim to work with other missional activities of the group e.g. Foodbank and other groups that use the church building e.g. Cafe Emm.

What can I do?

Volunteer to be on the Eco Church group

There will be simple Eco changes you can make at home in each edition of BERT

Be more aware of God's Creation and our impact on it and how we can improve it

Recycle as much household waste as possible in your kerbside collection or at the local recycling centre.

Don't just throw unwanted items away - your trash could be someone else's treasure. Give to charity, sell online (Facebook marketplace, ebay etc), giveaway (Freegle, community pages)

Reduce the amount of plastic you buy - e.g. buy loose fruit and veg in reusable veg bags, buy products packaged in non plastic packaging like cardboard or glass, use refillable options, take your own tubs to deli/meat/fish counters.

Re-use glass jars and plastic tubs for storing or transporting food instead of sandwich/freezer bags or foil which are often single use.

BAPTIST BIRTHDAY SCHEME



Every year, the total that Birthday Scheme members donate is over £250,000! We are a regular part of that!


- These gifts are having a huge impact, saving and transforming lives in countries across the world.
