Matthew Chapter 1 verse

God is not sat on a cloud looking down on the world through a celestial CCTV system. He is not ignorant to the challenges, opportunities and pain of the world because he became flesh and blood and experienced the ups, downs and frustrations of this world.

So we don't need to be down hearted. We can stand firm in the assurance of God's presence with us. After all, that is the translation of 'Emmanuel'. I suspect you will have heard this before, but let us take the familiar and engage with it.



Wonder afresh at the assurance that God is with us and that we should seek to follow God and glorify His name in all that we do and aspire to do.

What encourages me is the promise of God's presence in all the messiness and busyness of life as we aspire to be kingdom builders in this place.

Mud wrote the song 'Lonely this Christmas' but the message of Christmas is that ultimately Christmas exists to open the doorway of relationship between humanity and God and to assure us that because of Christmas, ultimately we are never alone.

On behalf of all at Emmanuel - may you have a great Christmas.

The answer is shocking to say the least . As I write this, 33 countries are at war!



Mary Langley now runs this group. The venue has changed several times over the years and also some of the people.


In the present group, some of us have been Christians for a number of years whilst others are beginning their journey with the Lord.


We had a packed church once again for Remembrance Sunday.



Give thanks for the work of the Foodbank, the volunteers and community services. Pray for volunteer drivers to come forward to collect donations from supermarkets.


We thank you for all of our clergy and leaders.
