Do you do whatever Jesus asks of you?

We would all like to say yes to that question, though responding to Jesus can be something we can struggle with. Saying yes might involve, being intentional, ourtime, discomfort, risk, sacrifice. We might say yes God, like Mary. But then we struggle and become distracted.

We may not know what is being asked of us this new season, as our lives are hurried or burdened, it's hard to listen to him or to notice his presence, or invitation. If you struggle with these things, you aren't alone. Yet saying yes to Jesus' invitations to draw near to him and join with him in what he asks of us, truly leads us on a journey of formation and transformation, so that our lives are changed and others too. The story of Jesus turning water into wine reveals to us that Jesus can still have an impact on our lives today. Jesus is attending a wedding celebration with his disciples. Everyone's there and they're having a wonderful time. But suddenly his mother Mary, urgently tells him that the wine has run out- a social and hospitality disaster. The family wouldn't live down the shame and then there's the bad luck associated with the marriage. Mary knew Jesus could help and would help and He does, even if he was not intending to perform his first miracle just yet! He's kind and compassionate, and sensitive to the need of the moment, whether big or small.

Jesus often responds to our needs in creative and unexpected ways. Mary asks the servants to do whatever Jesus asks, and they do. They might have wondered, what on earth are we doing, filling six jars with water? And it was tiring work. But they were true to Christ. We may wonder too sometimes what God is doing in our lives and in our church com-

munities, but we can trust that he is working and most likely unexpectedly.
And so, the water is transformed into wine. A lot of wine, for a lot of people.
Wine in abundance, so that the party can keep on going.

In this culture wedding events lasted three days. What a party! God provides for us all in abundance and in the blessing of his presence with us. It is a miracle. In this

moment, heaven is opened, and we see the transforming power of God burst into our world.

It's one of the moments in the Gospel where heaven and earth intersect with each other and point to a heavenly reality. With this event and more, the life of heaven came down to earth. "The word became flesh" 1:14. The transformation from water to wine says to us that Jesus can have, can still have today, an impact o n people's lives. He is active and involved. This is a story for the ones who run out of supplies because they didn't plan very well. This is a story for the ones who are scraping the bottom of the barrel. This is a story for the ones who need more than an example, and more than motivation. This story is for everyone who needs a miracle.

We really do have a down to earth God who can do a new thing in our lives. He cares about our needs and circumstances. Let's take Simon-Peter's and Mary's advice and do what Jesus tells us all to do, by sharing his good news, forgiving one another, serving-embracing his holy habits and trusting that God is actively with us



Jesus takes our emptiness and turns it into abundance. Jesus is not giving out rewards and punishments, Jesus is pouring out grace on us. We just need to accept it. Mary is relieved. The wedding party is saved. It's a joint effort. Transformation is the dimension of reality that comes to being when Jesus is present, and when people do whatever, Jesus tells them.

He came that we might have life in all its fullness. He can take us from a sense of hopelessness to a fullness of life, and overflowing. He can turn our weeping into laughter, out failures into a witness of transforming power.

When there is no practical solution, when the problem was your fault, when you're halfway through a party and the celebration is about to end because of your short-sightedness and lack of preparation — look, and see Jesus, turning water into wine, even though it wasn't His plan to start His ministry like this. Jesus asked Simon Peter at the beach to leave everything and to follow him, and he did. He left the security of his family behind, his way of life and his job there in that place.

Mary said yes to her pregnancy with the Son of God and all that would mean. They both responded in ways that were true to Christ and full of faith.

We are Jesus' disciples today, and we are invited to follow him faithfully and to trust him, too. It's not easy as we know. To say yes, I will actively follow you, I will try to do what you ask of me, even though we know the road ahead is most probably bumpy, is a good start to seeing transformation in our lives and those around us. Lives transformed requires us to actively pursue transformation. To invite God in, to follow his ways and practices through the Holy spirit. Jesus has come to transform us, to take us on from where we are, to a new way of being.

Can you be with, pray and listen to God-Praying, what are you asking of me, and of my church community, this new year?
Can you ask God if there are people he wants you to encounter this week? This might mean taking the bold step of saying hello with a smile, or to invite someone to church.

Seek his grace and compassion. Can you lean into Jesus' habits and practices that he invites us into, to be with him, become more like him and do as he did? Jesus cares about us, our needs, our hopes, our fullness and flourishing. He wants to transform our lives in extra ordinary ways. But transformation only came when someone took Mary's words seriously -

'Do whatever he tells you to do'.




Youth Worker, University Chaplain and Mission Enabler to Circuit Safeguarding Officer. I look forward to getting to know you all!

Alpha Course January 2025

January 2025, a New Year and a new opportunity to learn about Jesus.

The congregation discussed running an Alpha course mid-way through 2024, and the New Year seemed the best time to start a new course.

Alpha is a series of group conversations that freely explore the basics of the Christian faith in an open, friendly environment. Everyone is welcome no matter your background or beliefs. https://alpha.org.uk/about Each weekly session will be an opportunity to have tea and refreshments, time to watch a DVD on the set topic and discussion.

The First week's topic "Is there More to Life Than This?". The discussion that takes place after watching the video, asks questions like "What makes you happy?" and "If there was a God after all and you could ask one question. What would it be?"

To be honest after being a Christian for a good while, these questions can be as challenging to think about and answer as for someone who is just beginning their journey.

The eleven-week course covers subjects on :Who is Jesus?; How can I have Faith?; Why and How do I pray?; How does God Guide Us? How does God Health Today? And What about the Church?

The prayer sessions will be useful as the ministry team want to encourage prayer as a priority this year, with the Rev Stewart Betts, offering to meet people in small groups, over 3 sessions to encourage and enable people to feel more confident in leading prayer sessions.

On the web site https://story.alpha.org/ there are individual stories of people like Moses from Nairobi, who lived in an area of high crime and spoke to a pastor when he was in prison. With support and listening to Alpha he was able to turn his life around. These stories inspire and remind us that every life won for Christ is a life saved.

Please continue to pray for the congregation at Rectory Farm and pray that those who attend the course, hear and see for themselves that learning and knowing Jesus can change their lives too.



First things first...

12th January 2025 - Dear all, today I (Stewart) had the pleasure of Boothville's company. I had been speaking on the 'Baptism of Jesus' which forms the 2nd Sunday in Epiphany. One of the ministry team came up to me and felt that the Holy Spirit had suggested that part of what I said was relayed to the wider Emmanuel Group.

We, as a ministry team want to encourage prayer as a priority this year. It will be the Theme of the Lent booklet which will be circulated and after Easter we will have a Sermon Series on Prayer, looking at different aspects of praying. But, returning to Sunday the 12th and for context I have included the final 2 verses of the gospel reading along with some of the words I used.

Luke 3.21-22

When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Another theme in early Luke - and please do go home and read through the first four chapters together and you will see an emphasis on the Holy Spirit activity well before this day.

Therefore, the dove is not just making a guest appearance. The suggestion from Luke is that the spirit has been at work in all these events. I also want to challenge a lot of artistic depictions of this event because from the reading of the text Jesus isn't just coming up from the water, he has been baptized with many others and is praying.

The main event has taken the stage, heaven has opened and declares the news of Jesus. We see in this part of the story, Father, Son and Spirit working together in God's mission - to bring healing and hope to the people. As I was reflecting on all this and more!! I could see the order of these events, the expectation and anticipation, the warm up and then the main event but in between the warm up and the headline act we have Jesus stopping for prayer... There would be lots to be done, his ministry was about to really get into the spotlight, yet as we know the wilderness and the calling of the disciples are just round the corner. So there was lots to pray about.

God is great, God is with us, through Jesus and the Holy Spirit, as I said after Christmas. Jesus incarnation was not a one off event, he is born in the lives of believers. God is also God - we are God's people, it sounds simple but too often I wonder whether expectations are not reversed, the people tell God what they want.

Jesus on the cusp of public ministry, sets an important example in prayer. Max Lucado writes: We can do much after we pray. But we should do nothing before we pray. Let's start with prayer.

My friends, prayer will be a theme this year, I want us to inhabit that picture of Christ in prayer. As we pray for the Emmanuel Group let us just tell God what we want but open ourselves up to what God wants from us. I honestly believe that both want and need to have an epiphany of God in the life and work of all at Emmanuel Group.

You see, epiphany is the grasping of the promises God makes, the sending of Jesus and the sending on of his followers, that has

not changed. So may all we do, stay and seek to do and say be grounded in God and be to his glory.

Amen


